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Introduction, History, and Location

Brief history and Introduction



The Menéndez Pelayo International University (UIMP) was created in 1932 by a decree of the Spanish Second Republic, initially named the "International Summer University of Santander." Its headquarters were established in the Palacio de la Magdalena, which had served as the summer residence of the Spanish royal family from 1913 to 1930, donated by the Santander City Council to King Alfonso XIII.

The first courses were held in the summer of 1933 under the direction of historian and philologist Ramón Menéndez Pidal as Rector and poet and professor Pedro Salinas as Secretary General. During the summers of 1933–1936, a wide range of courses were organized at the palace, attracting distinguished national and international figures. This was also when the Spanish language and literature courses for foreign students began.

These activities were interrupted by the Spanish Civil War and resumed in 1945 when the UIMP was officially reestablished, with its headquarters in the former San Rafael Hospital in Santander. In the summer of 1949, the University returned to the Palacio de la Magdalena as its main site.



Due to the increasing demand for its academic programs, the university built the Las Llamas Campus in Santander, with modern facilities including classrooms and accommodation for international students attending Spanish language, literature, and humanities courses.

Today, in addition to its traditional academic activities in Santander (Cantabria), UIMP also offers accredited postgraduate education within the European Higher Education Area.

The university organizes non-formal and continuing education

programs across its academic centers in various cities including Barcelona, Valencia, Seville, Santa Cruz de Tenerife, A Coruña, Cuenca, La Línea de la Concepción, the Pyrenees, and Cartagena.

Courses in Santander

The city of Santander is the capital of Cantabria, a region that is one of the most popular destinations for Spanish tourism due to its natural and scenic wealth and landscape that combines sea and mountains, its diverse ecosystems, excellent gastronomy and a wide range of sports, cultural and leisure activities for all types of visitors. Our Spanish courses are held at the Campus de las Llamas, which is the University's permanent headquarters in Santander. The Center of the Campus de las Llamas is labelled Accredited Center by the Instituto Cervantes for the teaching of Spanish as a foreign language, since 2014.



Before You Arrive: Practical Information

2.1. Enrollment Process

The minimum age required to enroll is 18. Students aged 16 or 17 may also apply, provided they submit a **completed Parental Authorization form** (available on our website), signed by their parents or legal guardians, along with the pre-registration form.

Application and Required Documents: Students wishing to enroll must complete the **pre-registration form** available on our website and submit it to the Student Office along with the following:

- A copy of a valid ID or passport
- If underage, the signed Parental Authorization form

Once the pre-registration form is received, the Student Office will send the student a cost estimate and payment instructions for both the course and accommodation, if booked through UIMP.

How to Pay: After the spot is confirmed, students have 10 days to complete the payment.

If registration is completed **less than 21 days** before the course starts, payment must be made immediately after confirmation.

2.2 Accommodation

Students enrolled in the courses may request accommodation either in UIMP university residences or with a host family.

Las Llamas Residence – Las Llamas Campus





The residence is located on the Campus of Las Llamas, near the Spanish Language Courses, and Training Courses for ELE Teachers.

Rooms: Single or double with private bathroom, with accessible options available.

Facilities: Library, cafeteria, dining hall, study rooms, computer rooms, kitchen, laundry and self-service washing machines, parking, green areas, and sports facilities. 24-hour reception.

Host Family Accommodation



Host Family Accommodation is a fantastic way to immerse yourself in Spanish language and culture in everyday situations

2.3 Visas

For EU students:

No visa is required. A valid passport or national ID is sufficient for all administrative and daily activities in Spain.

For Non-EU Students:

You must apply for a student visa through the Spanish Embassy or Consulate in your country. An official admission letter is required to apply for the visa. You can request it from: esp.santander@uimp.es

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Students must complete full payment to receive the official admission document, which will include their personal info, passport number, course dates, and accommodation address (if applicable).

In case of visa denial:

If your visa is denied, UIMP will refund the payment, provided you notify them in writing **before the course starts**, and submit the official refusal document issued by the Embassy or Consulate. (Administrative fees of €22.50 are non-refundable).

2.4 Health Insurance

Health insurance is not included in the tuition fee.

1. EU, UK, or Swiss Students:

We recommend bringing the **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** to access public health services during your stay. Request the card from your home country's healthcare provider before traveling.

Academic Information

Enrolment for the Spanish as a Foreign Language Courses includes:

- 1. Teaching material
- 2. A guided tour of Santander
- 3. Placement test
- 4. The student card for the use of all UIMP facilities

3.1 Your first days at UIMP

Before arriving at UIMP, all students can take an **online placement test** to determine their approximate level of Spanish. Based on the results, students will be temporarily assigned to a group.

Monday – First Day of Class:

From 8:45 AM: Students can collect their ID and documentation at the Student Office.

At 9:00 AM: General course orientation in the Emilio Alarcos Room (2nd Floor, Central Building). Attendance is mandatory.

At 9:30 AM: Students who did *not* complete the online placement test must take the mandatory inperson test. Locations will be posted on the information board.

Students who already completed the online test will go directly to their assigned class with their teacher.

Monday Afternoon:

After reviewing placement test results and in-class performance, final group assignments will be posted on the information boards. This list will include the student's name, assigned classroom, and instructor.

Each teacher will hand out a **course selection form** for optional complementary subjects. Students must complete and return the form, selecting electives suited to their level.

To receive a certificate, students must attend at least **85**% of language and culture classes. Attendance must be signed on the official attendance sheet for each course.

≥ Workshops and other courses



For those students who are interested in Spanish life and culture, there are also workshops on cooking, dancing, and other extracurricular activities available. A minimum number of participants is required to carry out these activities.

Workshops (cooking, dance and Spanish music): 53 € (10 hours)

3.2 Attendance Certificates and Diplomas

Attendance Certificate:

All students who attend at least 85% of classes will receive a certificate issued by UIMP according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

For groups from universities or international institutions, UIMP can issue **custom reports or credit certificates** upon request (e.g., US system credits, academic evaluations).

Diplomas:

Students may take an exam to obtain a **UIMP Spanish Diploma**, certifying their language proficiency. Interested students must register at the Course Office and pay the exam fee.

3.3 ECTS Accreditation Program

Students requiring ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) certification must inform UIMP during enrollment and meet these conditions:

- Attend at least 85% of registered classes
- Complete class activities and pass the final exam

4.2 Computer Rooms

Wi-Fi is available throughout the Las Llamas Campus. Students can also use the designated **computer rooms**:

Important: Students may not install software or modify system settings. Maximum usage time per session is 30 minutes (unless no one is waiting). A waitlist will be established during busy periods

4.3 Library



Location: Central Classrooms Pavilion (above the cafeteria)

Hours: Monday to Friday — 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM

Features:

- 90% of the collection is free access
- Materials include books on Spanish language, linguistics, art, geography, history, and literature (Spain and Latin America)
- Audiovisual resources: language learning audio tapes and Spanish films/documentaries
- Free access with your UIMP student ID

- Books, tapes, and videos available for loan

Climate

Santander has a humid oceanic climate.

Humidity is generally high throughout the year, often exceeding 90%.

Winter temperatures average around 10°C (50°F), with lows around 6°C (43°F).

Summer temperatures are mild and rarely exceed 25°C (77°F).

Currency

The official currency is the **Euro** (€).

Currency exchanges can be made at any bank or at the airport.

During Santander's local festival ("Semana Grande", July 21–25, 2025), banks close at 12:00 PM

You can buy a **rechargeable transport card** at tobacco shops (estancos) for €6.60 (10 rides)
